The Oelwein Public Library Board of Trustees held their meeting on Tuesday, July 9, 2024 at 5:15 p.m. at the Oelwein Public Library.

Present: Mars, VanDenHul, Franzen, Seeders, and Macken **Absent:** Ingersoll, Kerns Vice-president VanDenHul called the meeting to order at 5:21 p.m.

Agenda and Minutes Approved: Mars made a motion to approve the agenda and the minutes. Seconded by Franzen. Motion carried.

Correspondence: none

Trustee Training: The board reviewed the standard on providing adequate handicap parking spaces.

Director's Report:

- Summer Reading Program Sixty-nine people, ranging in ages from young children to adults, were registered for the summer reading program. The registrations last year were 71.
- Smokey Bear Program Children can read books and earn badges through the Smokey Bear program. The program runs through November 28.
- Creature Feature This month, Fontana naturalists gave a program on toads.
- Book Club Oelwein Reads will meet at Ampersand on July 25. They will be discussing *The Annie Year* by Stephanie Wilbur Ash, an Oelwein graduate.
- Security Camera The garden camera has been taking on water in the lens. A replacement camera is ordered.
- Library Page Erin is resigning her position to attend college in August. Staff have started advertising for the position.
- Annual Survey The library board reviewed the annual survey statistics. Downloadable audio usage is
 low compared to use at other libraries in our size category, especially compared to Independence.
 Macken will ask their director to what they attribute their high usage. As to youth programming,
 Franzen will reach out to the chess teacher about holding some of the practices and tournaments at the
 library. In addition, Franzen would like to bring students to the library for stories and activities, and to
 check-out books when weather permits. The Husky Adventure funding will end in December.

• Director's Vacation – The director will be on vacation from July 15-August 2. Friend's Report:

• Friends of the Library are sponsoring the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program for this fiscal year.

Bills: Mars made a motion to approve the list of bills. Seconded by Franzen. Motion carried.

Non-contracting Cities: Discussion was held on whether to allow people to check out library materials if their cities do not have a library and their city has not signed a contract with another city for library services. Oelwein will not receive Open Access reimbursements for items checked out to people from non-contracting cities. Mars made a motion to deny check-out privileges to people from non-contracting cities. Seconded by Franzen. Motion carried.

Policy Review: Fines and Charges – The registration policy states that Out-Of-State cardholders will be assessed an annual \$20.00 library card fee. The director suggests adding this statement to the Fines and Charges policy. Franzen made a motion to approve the policy as revised. Seconded by Mars. Motion carried.

Adjournment: Mars made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:00 p.m.
